

Safeguarding Policy of the Church of England

The Church of England's safeguarding statement offers six overarching policy commitments:

- Promoting a safer environment and culture
- Safely recruiting and supporting all those with any responsibility related to children, young people and vulnerable adults within the Church
- Responding promptly to every safeguarding concern or allegation
- Caring pastorally for victims / survivors of abuse (i.e. children, young people or vulnerable adults) and other affected persons
- Caring pastorally for those who are the subject of concerns or allegations of abuse and other affected persons
- Responding to those that may pose a present risk to others.

We are committed to

- The care, nurture of, and respectful pastoral ministry with, all children, young people and vulnerable adults
- The safeguarding and protection of all children, young people and vulnerable adults
- The welfare of the child, young person and vulnerable adult is paramount
- Integrity, respect and listening to all
- Transparency and openness
- Accountability
- Collaboration with key statutory authorities and other partners
- Use of professional safeguarding advice and support both inside and outside the Community and Church
- A commitment to the prevention of abuse
- The active management of risk
- Promoting a culture of informed vigilance
- Regular evaluation to ensure best practice

To this end:

- We will promote a safer environment and culture demonstrated by the fact that the Trustees and members of the Community believe that a vulnerable person should never experience abuse of any kind. We have a responsibility to promote the welfare of all such people and to keep them safe. We are committed to live, work and practise our faith in a way that protects them.
- We will treat all those who live or work in our Community with care and respect.

- We will make all those who live and work in our Community aware of our Safeguarding policy and procedures.
- We will carefully select, support and train all those with any responsibility within the Community, staff or volunteers, in line with the principles of Safer Recruitment.
- We will provide appropriate Safeguarding training to all Trustees, members of the Community, staff and volunteers.
- We will respond promptly to every safeguarding concern or allegation.
- Those who raise safeguarding concerns will be treated with understanding and respect, as will the person(s), against whom the concern or allegation is made.
- We will take care to ensure that the Community, staff and volunteers are aware of their roles and responsibilities in managing safeguarding procedures, including referral to the appropriate and / or statutory authorities.
- We will seek to offer informed pastoral care and support to anyone who has suffered abuse, developing with them an appropriate ministry that recognises the importance of understanding the needs of those who have been abused, including their feelings of alienation and / or isolation.
- We will seek to protect children, young people or vulnerable adults and other affected persons from the possibility of further harm and abuse.
- We will seek to offer pastoral care and support for those who are the subject of concerns or allegations of abuse and other affected persons.
- We will seek to offer pastoral care and support, including supervision, to those that may pose a present risk to others.
- This policy and Safeguarding procedures documents shall be reviewed annually in the Chapter and by the Designated Safeguarding Person and the Board of Trustees.

In all these principles we will follow legislation, guidance and recognised good practice. The Church of England has approved the following safeguarding policies:

The adoption of these policies is demonstrated by the appointment of a Designated Safeguarding Person, who is advised by the Diocesan Safeguarding Adviser and being engaged in safeguarding training on a regular basis.
